"Do you SPEAK another language?" will explore what is meant by classroom talk, why it is important and how we can create a safe space in our classrooms where our learners feel comfortable and confident enough to participate fully in speaking activities.

During the session, we'll explore and critique the evidence base, reflect on current practice and identify small tweaks which might impact positively on attitudes and outcomes for your learners.

Developing a knowledge-rich, rigorous curriculum in MFL, which is engaging and where pupils make excellent progress

There are high expectations around pupils having a knowledge-rich and rigorous curriculum, but how do we ensure that this is also fun, motivating and engaging, and all the while making sure that pupils are making excellent progress. In addition, we have the challenge of the 2026 GCSE, in which 50% of the vocabulary is different from the current GCSE. This session will show how a well-planned MFL curriculum from Y7 to Y11 can have a strong impact on progress, motivation and engagement.
