#### Kingsman: The Golden Circle


'Kingsman: The Golden Circle', co-written, co-produced and directed by Matthew Vaughn, is the sequel to the 2014 film 'Kingsman: The Secret Service' that was in turn based on the comic book by Dave Gibbons and Mark Millar. The film stars Mark Strong, Taron Egerton and Colin Firth in returning roles as well as Julianne Moore, Halle Berry, Elton John, Channing Tatum and Jeff Bridges.

The film follows the agents of the Kingsman Secret Service who must head over to the USA to join forces with the 'Statesman', their American counterparts, after their headquarters is destroyed by an evil crime syndicate known as 'The Golden Circle'.

After the first film was received very positively both critically and at the box office, grossing over \$400 million worldwide, the film was first announced on 29<sup>th</sup> April 2015. Filming began on 15<sup>th</sup> May 2016 and wrapped in September of the same year, and the final film is set to be released on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2017.








#### **Apple Announces New Line of Products**

They first announced the iPhone 8 which is the next phone to the iPhone 7, is pretty much the same as it and isn't really very interesting... 

### Does the UK need a body farm?

You are dead. Now what? It's the start of a fascinating and eventful - if gory and smelly - journey, at least for your body as it decomposes. Understanding decomposition can hold the key to solving murders, finding missing people and crucially recognising them, and that is why "body farms" exist.

Body farms are essentially outdoor laboratories where experiments using donated human cadavers investigate taphonomy - the science of decomposition.

Exciting new data suggests that the succession of bacteria that come and go, feeding on the decaying body, may help scientists to more accurately pinpoint time of death, far better than insect infestation.

Lead Scientist, Dr Williams firmly believes that a UK body farm facility will allow forensic science to flourish in Britain, producing new data on decomposition bespoke to our climate and situation.







# **Recipe of the Week – 'Super' Foods**

What are super foods? Whilst there is no such thing as a zero-calorie food, there are foods you can enjoy freely without having to worry about packing on the pounds. These foods are generally:

mostly made up of water; low in calories; contain fibre, help make you feel and stay full; packed with plenty of vitamins, antioxidants, and other nutrients which can have numerous benefits for your health.

### Ricotta, Blackberry and Pine Nut Tartine (Serves 2)

Prep time 5 mins/ Cooking time 5 mins

### Ingredients

2 tablespoon maple syrup; 150g backberries; 4 slices of bread; 100g soft Ricotta; 1 tablespoon pine nuts; mint leaves

### Method



Warm the maple syrup in a <u>frying pan</u> over a medium heat. Add the blackberries and cook for 4-5 mins, squashing some of the fruit with the back of a wooden spoon to soften it and create a fruity syrup. Meanwhile, toast the bread. To serve, spread some ricotta over each slice, spoon over the warm fruit and juices and top with the pine nuts and mint.
