


I am delighted to introduce our first Literary Festival programme.




Linda will be talking to A-level Creative Writing students about the publishing industry. She will also be providing feedback on their work as part of a crime writing competition.


Linda also writes crime fiction under the pseudonym Christina James.





Linda will be running a crime writing workshop with Year 10 students.




Using first hand experiences of extreme environments, Michael will talk to Year 8 and Year 9 pupils about how he gathers information for non-fiction books.


Steve will be talking to Year 7 pupils about his exciting collection of books.




Michael will be running a poetry writing workshop with Year 8 pupils.



Mark Winchester specialises in decorative narrative pictures using digital software such as Photoshop.





Our visiting Illustrators will be delivering a talk about Art and Design courses at University. They will be sharing their portfolios of work and giving lots of practical advice to students.









Public Event: Priory LSST Arts Anthology (9th May)




