Preparation for learning History at A Level: Tudor England 1485-1603

If you are considering taking History at A Level then below are some suggestions for how you might want to prepare for this. This document focuses on the side of the course looking at Tudor History 1485-1603. <u>At the end there are some tasks</u> you can undertake to direct your reading and research. These are optional, of course, but should help focus any 'wider reading' you do.

Overview of the A Level Course

We study the AQA specification which can be accessed here:

AQA History Specification

We do units <u>1C (Tudors)</u> and <u>2N (Russia 1917-53)</u>. The 'NEA' (Coursework) will be on the <u>Arab-Israeli</u> <u>conflict 1896-2017</u>. In general, you can use the specification as your guide and research any topics you like! There are also past/specimen exam papers on there.

For the Tudor section of the course:

A good place to start is to watch The King in the Car Park on YouTube about Richard III. It should give you a sense of the Wars of the Roses:

You should then complete the tasks on SharePoint/Website entitled 'Introductory Material for <u>Tudor History</u>' which includes research tasks on the Wars of the Roses and profiles on Richard III, Henry VII and Henry VIII.

After this complete the tasks on the 'The Battle of Bosworth Preparation Tasks' PowerPoint.

You will be into Henry VII territory then so you next task is to watch The Winter King on YouTube to see what he was really like:
