# Advice from the RE Department



- The most important part of revision for students is to learn the key terms.
- If they do not know what a word means, this can often result in them being unable to attempt a question, or result in them giving a response about something completely different.
- Learning the key terms helps them learn a good chunk of information, so this is not time wasted.
- A list of the key terms is on SharePoint.

- Secondly, students need to learn any theory.
- There are some things they can work out for themselves:
  - E.g. Give two ways that humans use animals
    - Answer pets, food
- However, there is theory that they need to know:
  - E.g. The Law of Abortion
  - The aims of punishment
  - Just War and Holy War theories





- Third, students must learn religious views and responses.
- There are sheets of religious teachings on SharePoint that students can download and learn.
- However, as every topic includes conflicting views and teachings, it is important that they THINK about the teachings in relation to the topics studied.

- Finally, students must look at past questions and make sure that they understand the command words.
- E.g. If the question asks for religious believers' views, they need to explain what they think and teach.
- If the question asks for responses, they need to explain what religious people do.



 Teachers have emphasised these repeatedly, but students must make sure they are confident about what is expected, and take the opportunity to ask about anything they are unsure of while there is time.



## Which topics to revise

- FURTHER GUIDANCE FROM THE EXAMINATION BOARDS WILL BE PASSED ON THE STUDENTS.
- For Paper 1, students will be given 2 answer books which have the questions in them, one with questions on Christian Beliefs and Christian Practices, and one with Jewish Beliefs and Jewish Practices. They must answer <u>ALL</u> questions.
- For Paper 2 they will be given a blank answer book and a questions paper. They must do <u>ONLY FOUR</u> questions. They must answer these from the perspective of Christianity, but learn the views of different denominations.
- We have only studied:
- Theme A: Relationships and Families
- Theme B: Religion and Life
- Theme D: War, Conflict and Peace
- Theme E: Crime and Punishment

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## What skills to practise

• The most basic rule is the rule-of-two. Give 2 examples, give 2 teachings, give two reasons, etc....

#### <u>The dreaded 12-marker</u>:

- Students frequently ask 'How much should I write?'
- It is not about the quantity but rather than the quality.
- 'Development' means that:
  - a point is illustrated with an example,
  - the significance of the point to the questions is discussed,
  - it might be supported with a teaching,
  - it might be compared and contrasted with another point made.



### Advise from the exam board

- It is better to give fewer well-developed arguments than make many points with slight development.
- Points need to show knowledge and understanding in order to support the argument.
- However, the focus needs to be on:
  - Coherence
  - Solid justification
  - For different viewpoints



The conclusion may or may not be personal opinion, but it needs to be evaluation rather than a summary.

## Reading the question

- Reference to teachings is a MUST. References to religion must be integrated into the answer and used to make the argument, not just added in at a convenient spot.
- Students need to take a few minutes to read the question. Practising looking at past questions in advance is really useful to get used to the wording.
- 'Divorce is never right'.
  - This can include a secular viewpoint because the question is very broad.
- Religious believers should never support divorce'.
  - This question wants an analysis of the Christian views they have learnt and secular viewpoints are not likely to be correct unless they are well integrated into the discussion of the Christian views.

#### Teachings

#### • <u>NOTE</u>:

- The Themes paper will always say 'Religious believers' because they do not know which religion each school has focused on.
- For the Themes, we have focused on Christian views.
- Students do not need to learn or use a second religion.
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- They DO need to be able to explain contrasting Christian viewpoints for each of the topics studied.

## **Additional Revision Provided**

- Students have been directed towards a number of revision resources created and provided for them.
- ERevision –homework tasks are set but the students can access all of the topics and exercises as many times as they want to.
- Mrs Smith has been sending out 100 days of revision exercises which students are encouraged to engage with. All the Forms links for these are available on Sharepoint.
- I am starting to create exercises to help students drill in the key terms and teachings.



- HOWEVER, too often if is the students who need these least that dip into them the most.
  - The Key to effective revision is **<u>little and often</u>**.

# Finally – What can parents do to help?

- The most helpful things include:
  - Testing on Key Terms, religious teachings, content
  - Talking through the topics to help students think through the different perspectives and nuances
  - Challenge students to give justified reasons for the points they make.
    - Some Christians might allow abortion because they think it is sometimes OK. <u>NOT A JUSTIFIED REASON</u>
    - Some Christians might support abortion because it is kinder to allow an abortion than to force a woman to have a child if she cannot afford to look after it. <u>THIS IS A JUSTIFIED REASON</u>.
