# Behaviour and Attendance

We are aware that the Satchel One App does not currently show why a child has received a positive or negative point. We have fed back how frustrating this is to them. If you do want to see why your child received a positive

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or negative point you can do so by signing into the Satchel One website on a desktop computer or laptop (please be aware teachers do not always give comments, as it depends on what the point has been given for).

May we take this opportunity to ask for your continued support in maintaining our high standards of uniform. We have very high expectations of the standard of student uniform and do appreciate the crucial support of parents and carers in this. Some key points to note are:

- No nose piercings are permitted this includes Year 12 and 13;
- Ear piercings can only be one silver or gold stud in the lower lobe of each ear no earrings (Year 12 and 13 students can have additional ear piercings);
- No bracelets, no necklaces, only one plain ring;
- Trousers must not be skinny fit;
- Coats must be plain navy blue or black no hoodies After Easter coats must not be worn in lessons;
- Blazers must be worn at all times In Years 12 and 13 suit jackets must be worn at all times;
- Top buttons must be done up at all times;
- Shirts must be tucked in at all times.

Can we also remind parents, carers and students that chewing gum is not permitted and should not be brought into the Academy.

After twenty three years, the Priory Association will most likely fold at the end of the year given that two of the members, who hold key positions, will no longer have children in the Academy. The likelihood is that it will then have to close down because of a lack of new volunteers.
