## Attendance

For 2023/24 we ask for your continued support in maintaining high levels of attendance and punctuality. The Department for Education's (DfE) guidance identifies that pupils need to attend school regularly to benefit from their education. Missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Our aspiration for all students is that their attendance is 100%, in order for them to get the best from their learning. I understand that there may be times when absence is unavoidable. However, where it is avoidable, I ask that you work with the Academy and ensure your child(ren) is/are in school. In accordance with the\_DfE, any student with an attendance level of 90% or less, or who has more than 4.5 days of unauthorised absence in a 6-week period, may receive a fixed penalty fine. We, of course, look to work with students and families to avoid having to go down this route. Punctuality to school is also vitally important. Students who arrive late to the Academy have an unsettled start to the day and this can disrupt their own learning, as well as that of their peers. In addition, punctuality is a key life skill, which we are keen to promote and reinforce. As a result, lateness will be challenged, and sanctioned where appropriate. I would urge you to contact the Academy if you feel you would benefit from any support around this.

## **Mobile Phones**

We embrace the use of educational technology and we will help and support our students to navigate and make sense of the digital world around them. Indeed, there will be occasions where teaching staff will explicitly direct students to use certain apps, websites or other features in lessons. That said, here at LSST we believe our number one priority is the safety and happiness of every child, and students' wellbeing and mental health is being affected at times by the misuse of mobile phone technology. Therefore, we wish to reinforce our expectations regarding phone use during the academy day for the next academic year. From 8.30am (or as soon as students enter Academy buildings if earlier than this) until after 3.05pm students are only allowed to use mobile phones under explicit teacher instruction and supervision. Situations where students are not permitted to use their mobile phones includes (but is not limited to) checking the time, communicating home and completing school work. The only exception where students will be allowed to use their mobile phones not under direct teacher supervision is when students in Year 12 or Year 13 are in the Common Room. Sixth Form students are not allowed to use their mobile phones elsewhere. Whenever a student is found to be using their mobile phone, headphones, airpods or smartwatch without explicit teacher instruction (with the exception of Sixth Form students in the Common Room) the mobile phone will be confiscated and taken to the Pastoral Administration Assistant in the Pastoral Hub or to Sixth Form Reception. If there are regular occasions where a student is having their mobile phone confiscated then we will contact parents and carers to make arrangements for them to collect the device rather than it being able to go back to the student at the end of the day. We thank you for your support in this matter.

## Uniform

Our ethos is focused on having the highest expectations of our students to enable them to go on to be successful and aspirational citizens of the world with a great respect for others. As you are aware, a key part of this ethos is having high standards and high expectations with regards to student uniform. We firmly believe that understanding the importance of a smart and formal appearance will support all our students in their journeys beyond compulsory education. Indeed, one of the reasons so many parents and carers choose the Academy as the secondary school for their children is due to the high expectations around uniform to support a broad and enriching academic curriculum. Therefore, we look for your support to maintain these high standards and the continued success of the Academy and the young people in it by ensuring all students are fully equipped with the correct uniform at the start of the next academic year.
