Dear Parent/Carer

As this second module draws to a close, and the festive season is nearly upon us all, we have all taken time to reflect over the last two weeks of the many achievements accomplished either as individuals or groups of students. In our termly presentation assemblies, it has been lovely to witness many, many students awarded with awards highlighting once again their commitment to our five core values of Inspiration, Aspiration, Respect, Resilience and Innovation.

As with any 14 weeks in our academic calendar there has been much to enjoy. The most recent being our annual Carol Concert where we were once again dazzled by so many talented musicians and writers. It has been lovely to welcome parents and carers from Years 7, 8, 11 and 13 to their annual Parents' Consultation Evening and meet current and new parents and carers at both our Year 6 and Post 16 Open Evenings. This award sits alongside our current accreditations a Computing Hub for the National Centre for Computing Education (NCCE), a Science Learning Partnership and a Stimulating Physics Network (SPN) Lead school. We were pleased to provide some year groups from Heighington Primary School with a base following the flooding at the start of the October half term. Due to a delay in their temporary accommodation being completed we shall continue to support them until February half term.

We are very sad to be saying goodbye and I am confident you will join me in thanking them for their hard work and dedication while at the Academy and wish them well for their future adventures. In addition, I am pleased to announce Mr B Smith (Teacher of Drama/Head of Year) will also be gradually returning to the Academy after his illness and subsequent operation. Next term he will only be supporting some Drama lessons and Mrs R Curran will remain as Head of Year 9.

Some key points to note are:

- No nose piercings are permitted this includes Year 12 and 13;
- Ear piercings can only be one silver or gold stud in the lower lobe of each ear no earrings (Year 12 and 13 students can have additional ear piercings);

- Coats must be plain navy blue or black no hoodies After Easter coats must not be worn in lessons;
- Blazers must be worn at all times In Years 12 and 13 suit jackets must be worn at all times;
