IT Updates

From January, students in Key Stage 3 and 4 will no longer be able to email other students using their academy accounts. Naturally, they will still be able to email staff and teachers for support.

I would like to also pass on an ongoing reminder that students will not be able to access academy services such as email or SharePoint whilst outside of the UK. This is part of our cyber security measures to protect data and

accounts. Please note: if a student uses a VPN on a personal device at home, the system may detect this as an overseas login. In such cases, the account will be locked until the student speaks with their Head of Year and it is unlocked by our IT support team.

Uniform

May we take this opportunity to ask for your continued support in maintaining our high standards of uniform. We have very high expectations of the standard of student uniform and do appreciate the crucial support of parents and carers in this.
