

# **Revision preparation**

Top tips for parents and carers on how to support revision at home, including make revision timetables, the importance of the mocks and what to do on examination days



#### Revision timetables

- A revision timetable is a plan for how your child is going to cover all of their revision in time for their exams. There's no one-size-fits-all to revision timetables.
- Sit with your child and help them create their own revision timetable, planning months ahead of exam time
- Smaller, regular revisions sessions are usually much more productive than cramming, so starting revision well in advance is a good strategy.

Need to start revision now!

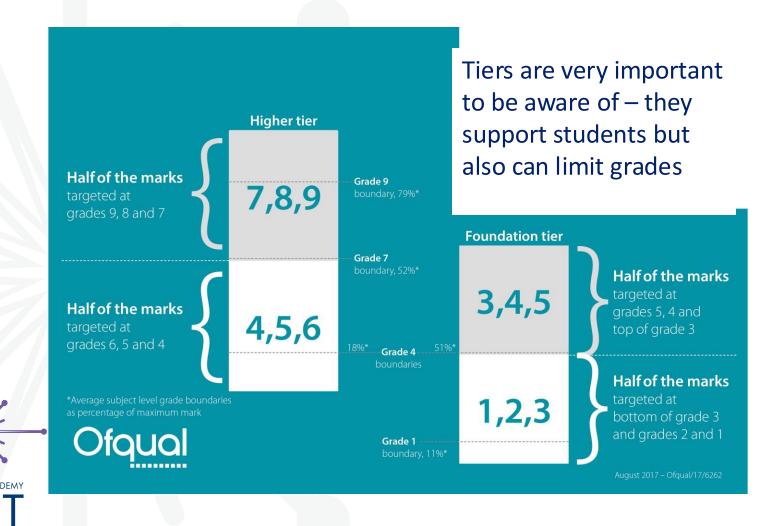
We use them along with tests scores to work out:
