What is an A Level?

- Type of Qualification: A Levels are academic qualifications.
- Duration: Typically take two years to complete.
- **Curriculum:** Focussed on a range of subjects (e.g., mathematics, science, humanities) chosen by the student.
- Assessment: Exams are the primary method of assessment, often taken at the end of the two-year programme.
- Entry Requirements: Generally require specific GCSE (or equivalent) grades for admission, which are detailed in the prospectus.
- Progression: Most students studying A Levels progress to university education or other higher education pathways.
 Students can also progress into apprenticeships or employment.


What is a T Level?

- Type of Qualification: T Levels are technical qualifications.
- **Duration:** Typically two years, including at least 45 days on an industry placement.
- **Curriculum:** Broad and specialised, combining classroom learning with practical skills related to a specific industry or profession.
- **Assessment:** Assessment includes a mixture of exams, coursework, and workplace assessment.
- Entry Requirements: Typically require specific GCSE (or equivalent) grades, which are detailed in the prospectus, and a genuine interest in the chosen field.
- **Progression:** Designed to lead directly to employment or further education (e.g. university or higher-level apprenticeships).
