The Priory Academy LSST Sixth Form Dress Code

One of the core values at The Priory Academy LSST is *Aspiration*. We instil an attitude of hard work and determination in our students and this is reflected in our formal style dress code. We want to prepare our students for work, present them as role models for lower school and as ambassadors within the wider academy community.

Parents/carers support their children when they choose to attend The Priory Academy LSST in the full knowledge of what our dress code requires of Sixth Form students. If students fall below our expected standards repeatedly, they may be asked to return home to change.

The Priory Academy LSST Sixth Form Dress Code

The student lanyard should be worn at all times for safeguarding those on site.

All students should wear a **two-piece business style outfit** that can consist of:

- ❑ Jacket and skirt
- ❑ Jacket and dress
- ❑ Jacket and tailored trousers

Where a skirt or dress is worn this should be of an appropriate length for a formal work environment.

Where a tailored shirt is worn this should be tucked in and worn with a tie.

When a tailored shirt is not worn a smart top should be worn. This should not be a Polo Shirt, have thin straps or be too low cut at the front.

Formal knitted jumpers may be worn under a jacket but should be of a V neck or crew neck style.

Sweatshirts/hoodies or jumpers with logos are not permitted. Chunky jumpers that cannot be worn under a jacket are also not permitted.

The Priory Academy LSST Sixth Form Dress Code

- Shoes or boots should cover the foot at the front and back and should not be in the style of 'Doc Martens' or 'Uggs'. Boots may be worn with a skirt or dress as well as with trousers, as long as they are of a formal work style.
- Hairstyles should be in accordance with smart formal dress – any dye should be of a natural colour.
- The Academy is responsible for ensuring that jewellery worn does not pose a risk to those on site. Visible piercings should be restricted to ear studs or small hoop earrings. One single nose piercing is permitted but should be a small stud rather than any other piercing. Please note permitted or non-visible jewellery may need to be removed for health and safety reasons as advised by the Academy.
- If there is any debate about an item of clothing the Headteacher's decision is final.

The Priory Academy LSST Sixth Form Dress Code

For practical PE lessons sixth form students are expected to wear the following;

- Plain navy or white T-shirt.
- Plain navy or black shorts/leggings/tracksuit bottoms. Shorts must not be Nike pro type shorts.
- Plain navy or black sweatshirt/hoodie.

16-19 Bursary

How will the Academy assess applications and allocate 16-19 Bursary Funding?

Students who are eligible for any level of funding should complete an application form and hand it to the member of staff responsible for the 16-19 bursary at the Academy. Applications will be assessed on the criteria below. Exceptional circumstances may be taken into account on application.

What funding could I receive?

There are three types of support available –

1. Vulnerable Bursary
2. Discretionary Bursary - To qualify for the discretionary bursary your total household income per year must be less than £24,652.00. (figure to be confirmed)
3. Laptop Loan

Details will be sent out on email as soon as it goes live and the links are on the website.

The Application deadline is normally the middle of September.

Attendance

Same as lower school – parents should ring in and report the absence on the attendance line.

If you have an appointment which you know about in advance then you should show the details of this to Mrs Caig in the GFB who will code the register accordingly.

Attendance concerns will be raised – Mrs Caig will alert HoY if your attendance drops below 95%

Supervised Study Periods (1 per subject) count as part of the allocated time and therefore attendance is compulsory.

Driving lessons can take place during a free period but you must have the form signed off before they can start.

The Sixth Form at The Priory Academy LSST is an exciting and vibrant place to study. Set in a fantastic learning environment for the needs of more than 500 students and offer over 35 subjects, all taught by dedicated and specialist staff. The ethos we have in the Sixth Form means that the vast majority of students progress to University at the end of Year 12, several to Oxbridge and various medical schools; all students, however, are supported thoroughly in whatever they choose.

The Sixth Form is proud of its excellent facilities. From the common room, to the Sixth Form canteen, study rooms and our students are not short of places to study and relax. Science students have a purpose built teaching block which includes a planetarium and Sports students have a climbing wall, gymnasium, pool and running track. Our students also benefit from a dedicated Sixth Form Manager and team available throughout the day who provide support for choosing courses, university careers as well as personal support from Form Tutors and Heads of Year.

As well as subjects to study, students can broaden their experiences in a number of ways, such as: participating in various extracurricular activities, completing Extended Project Qualifications, going out on work experience or joining the Cambridge Duke of Edinburgh scheme.
