Aquaman

'Aquaman' is a 2018 superhero film directed by James Wan, known for his work on many classic horror films such as 'Saw' and 'The Conjuring'. Distributed by Warner Brothers Pictures, it is the sixth instalment of the DC Extended universe. It stars Jason Momoa as Aquaman, alongside Amber Heard, Willem Dafoe, Patrick Wilson, Dolph Lundgren, Yahya Abdul-Mateen II, and Nicole Kidman. It is the first feature-length film to be based around the character.

The plot follows Arthur Curry, otherwise known as Aquaman, as the heir to the throne of the underwater kingdom of Atlantis. He must step forward to lead his people against his half-brother, Orm, who seeks to unite the seven underwater kingdoms against the surface world.

Development of the film began as far back as 2004, with the film finally releasing in the UK on 14 December. It received mostly positive reviews, receiving praise for its lighter tone compared to the rest of the DC films, the direction of the film, the visuals and Momoa's performance. However some reviews have criticised the messy plot and long runtime.
