SpaceX Rocket Launch Success

The Falcon Heavy was successfully launched from The Kennedy Space Centre. The main part of the launch was the thrusters. They return to earth after use so they can be re-cycled and re-used. It is so special as they are the first to do that.

Having such a large and powerful rocket should open up some fascinating new possibilities for Elon Musk and his SpaceX company.

These include launching: Much bigger satellites for use by US intelligence and the military - the scale of these satellites is limited by current rocket performance. Large batches of satellites, such as those for Mr Musk's proposed constellation of thousands of spacecraft to deliver broadband across the globe. Bigger, more capable robots to go to the surface of Mars, or to visit the outer planets such as Jupiter and Saturn, and their moons.

Hubble's successor, the James Webb Space Telescope, is having to be folded origami-like to fit in its launcher next year.

Opening date announced for new walkway to 1,000 space car park and 23,000 square feet shopping space in Lincoln

Set to be complete this autumn, construction work on a pedestrian walkway from Lincoln's Cornhill and 23,000 sq ft shopping space is underway. Well-known companies including Flying Tiger Copenhagen, Thomas Cook and Moss Bros have already opened at the Corn Exchange, whilst Cosy Club is set to open later this month.

Ongoing work on a group of shops in Sincil Street in order to create a passageway to the 1,000 space multi-storey car park at Lincoln Transport Hub as well as creating 23,000 sq ft of retail space. This £70m regeneration project in the Cornhill area is set to interest increasing numbers of visitors.

The site manager at Lindum, Tony Clohesy, announced, "So far we have taken down parts of the old units and we are about to begin piling the foundations, which involves drilling down 17 metres into the ground and then filling the hole with concrete."

As many reports have confirmed, a four-screen Every Man cinema is scheduled to be built opposite the Corn Exchange building facing onto the new Exchange square. This asset is set to open is Spring 2019.

Chief executive of Lincolnshire Co-op, Ursula Lidbetter, said, "We're pleased to announce these exciting milestones for the redevelopment of the Cornhill Quarter, which marks an important step towards our vision. On completion, we hope that the Cornhill Quarter will attract even more visitors from Lincoln and the surrounding area, as well as tourists from further afield."








Film of the Week

Elon Musk's Falcon Heavy rocket launches successfully

US entrepreneur Elon Musk has launched his new rocket, the Falcon Heavy, from the Kennedy Space Centre in Florida. The mammoth vehicle - the most powerful since the shuttle system - lifted clear of its pad without incident to soar high over the Atlantic Ocean.

With this debut, the Falcon Heavy becomes the most capable launch vehicle available. It is designed to deliver a maximum payload to low-Earth orbit of 64 tonnes - the equivalent of putting five London double-decker buses in space.

For this experimental and uncertain mission, however, he decided on a much smaller and whimsical payload - his old cherry-red Tesla sports car. A space-suited mannequin was strapped in the driver's seat, and the radio set to play a David Bowie soundtrack on a loop.

The Tesla and its passenger have been despatched into an elliptical orbit around the Sun that reaches out as far as the Planet Mars.
