The Purpose of Homework

- To encourage pupils to develop the skills, confidence and motivation needed to study effectively on their own. This is vital, given the importance for pupils in the future, of life long learning and adaptability in the workplace;
- To extend school learning, for example through additional reading;
- To consolidate, practise and reinforce skills and understanding developed at school;
- To sustain the involvement of parents and carers in the management of pupils' learning and keeping them informed about the work pupils are doing;
- To manage particular demands, such as GCSE coursework;
- To enable work not suited to the classroom situation such as research or surveys.

We also expect all pupils to read regularly and would expect them to read for 20 – 30 minutes each evening.

General Information

A Homework Timetable will be produced at the beginning of each year to ensure that the total amount of homework set for students, either daily or weekly, is consistent and manageable for them.

A Homework Diary (day book) will be provided for all pupils to record their homework. The Diary should be kept with them at all times, and students should get it out at the start of each lesson with their books, pens etc. Students who have lost their Diary can buy a new one from the SSA Office.

Homework should be written on the board before the end of the lesson, to give students a chance to copy it down. Teachers should check that the homework is written down, before students leave the classroom.

Teachers set homework, students complete it, parents sign the Diary each week, form tutors check and sign the Diary, with the process supervised by the Heads of Year. Tutors/Teachers should use the Diary to communicate with parents.

Homework should be an integral element of the curriculum and feedback from the homework should be built into following lessons.

Homework needs to be given a high profile around the school and homework that is completed well should be acknowledged and praised/rewarded through the merit system.

Condense the days notes onto revision cards

Print and complete a past paper

Test spellings of key words in your subjects
