<u>Coco</u>

Coco is Disney Pixar's latest animated film, following Cars 3 from summer of last year. It follows a young Mexican boy with a passion for music who accidently ends up in the Land of the Dead, and, with the help of of his deceased great-great-grandfather, must return to the living world. The events are centred around the famous Mexican festival, 'The Day of the Dead', in which people celebrate those who have died.

It stars an all-Latino voice cast of Anthony Gonzalez, Gael García Bernal, Benjamin Bratt, Alanna Ubach, Renée Victor, Ana Ofelia Murguía, and Edward James Olmos, being the world's first film with a nine digit budget to feature one. It is directed by Lee Unkrich and Adrian Molina.

Coco has received vastly positive reviews, with 97% on Rotten Tomatoes, and and an 81 on metacritic. The film has been praised for its touching story about the nature of family and death, its original songs, its animation, and its depiction of Mexican culture. It has picked up the nomination for Best Animated Picture at the 90th Academy Awards, and it won the Golden Globe late last year.

It is about a fourteen-year-old girl named Angelique Lacroix and the story is set in the first World War.

In 1916, she discovers her father's death on the frontline. When soldiers are fighting at war, Angelique has her own battles to brawl. Yet she doesn't know that she will have to begin a long, hard and tiring journey across France, escorted by a flock of resplendent geese.
