Kian Watkins – Year 7 Prize Giving Guest Speaker



After leaving LSST in 2022, Kian took a gap year and then started an Aerospace Engineering degree at the University of Birmingham. One of his most exciting challenges was last year, where he found himself as aviation director for a summer camp in Los Angeles, California. He had to adapt to a new environment, new culture and new challenges over 5,000 miles away from home. Soon enough though, he was thoroughly enjoying teaching young people and even got the chance to fly over the city each week. Kian is currently completing an industrial placement at Leonardo UK, putting his engineering skills into practice at the forefront of aviation with the UK's next generation fighter, Tempest. In his speech Kian said, "Being a student at LSST taught me a critical skill that has made everything possible, saying yes to new experiences, especially when I wasn't sure if I'd succeed. Every one of those moments helps you grow. They shape who you are, and they often lead you somewhere you'd never expect. Be open to learning, to trying, to failing, and trying again. You never know where your path will lead. But the truth is, some of the best opportunities in life don't come when you're ready – they come when you're willing."

After leaving LSST in 2022, Ella started an undergraduate degree in Sociology at Loughborough University. As part of her degree, Ella completed a placement year as a National Organisational Learning and Development Assistant with the Metropolitan Police. She worked on National Debriefs for Operations and Exercises, as well as supported the running of a national exercising program. She also spent time modernising and creating resources to support the business process. Ella is the ex CCF Senior Cadet at the academy and is now the Senior Cadet at university. Ella has taken on many new roles at university including the Action Point for the Student Union.

Elizabeth Still (Leaver July 2021) - Prize Giving Guest Speaker



It is with great sadness that we must report the passing of Mr Nick Milner on Monday 1st September 2025. Mr Milner was part of the Priory Academy LSST since its opening as the Lincoln School of Science and Technology in 1994 until his retirement in July 2021. He was dedicated to all his students and he loved teaching Mathematics across all year groups and abilities right up to the very brightest students studying A level Further Mathematics. In addition to his teaching Mr Milner was a regular contributor to extra-curricular activities including Duke of Edinburgh and girls' football to name but a few and some of you will remember his years as Head of Avalon House.

Many of you will recall Mr Milner from school trips to visit universities or longer residential trips for maths revision or trips abroad for skiing. He enjoyed every moment and

never complained, even when having to deal with travel sick children in the middle of the night on long coach journeys to the ski resorts. In his later years at the Academy Mr Milner spent much of his time supporting A Level students wanting to apply to Oxbridge or for Medicine. Many of you will appreciate the time he put into supporting with personal statements, mock interviews and UCAS applications etc. Mr Milner was more than just a teacher; he was a mentor and an inspiration and we know that many of you have followed in his footsteps into the teaching profession. Mr Milner was extremely proud of you all and he loved to hear how you were all progressing after you left the Priory.
